18 year old bride-to-be attacked with acid over money disputes in Cox's Bazar just 3 days before wedding

Resident of Gorjonia Union of Ramu Upazilla, Coxs's Bazar, Taiyeba was a domestic help at Badsha Mia's-father of 3 sons. The oldest son Nurul Absar borrowed money from Taiyeba's brother Aziz one time. When asked to return the money, Nurul attacked Aziz and beat him up following a bitter quarrel. Police settled the matter but Nurul felt his pride was wounded. So, along with another man-Farid Alam, he took out his vengeance on Taiyeba throwing acid on her.

days prior to her wedding, enduring over 7% burns, severe burns on the right side of her face, and the right eye in critical condition requiring urgent treatment. She was first taken to Cox's Bazar Sadar Hospital and then transferred to Chittagong Medical College Hospital due to worsening condition. Taiyeba's father is unable to bear her costly treatment being a day

laborer but he nevertheless filed a case under Acid Control Act 2002 resulting in Nurul's prompt arrest. The second defendant is however yet to be apprehended. The feud over only 500 BDT slaughtered Taiyeba's dream of being


